Martin is currently Chair of the Department of History & Political Science at King University, as well as co-founder of the North American Organization of Scottish Historians (NOSH).

He studied literature and philosophy at Wheaton College, then received the Masters of Divinity from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary, and finally a PhD from the University of Edinburgh.

His expertise is the history of Christianity, especially Medieval and Reformation. Martin co-chaired the John Knox 500 International Conference in 2015 that was sponsored and organized by the Presbyterian Heritage Center in Montreat.

He has taught at King University since 2004. He lives in Bristol with his wife Heather. They have two children.
